First Planned Industrial City Paterson, NJ

Founded in 1792 by Alexander Hamilton and the Society for Useful Manufactures, Paterson, New Jersey became the first planned industrial city in the United States. But it didn't happen overnight. Paterson's history goes much further back before the establishment of the S.U.M., and the major industries that made Paterson world-renowned in industries such as silk, locomotives and airplane engine production.

On Thursday, April 20, 2023, Mr. Giacomo DeStefano historian and director of operations of the Paterson Museum will share his knowledge at our Annual Dinner.









The third historical marker has been ordered and will be placed at the Salt Box Museum. In support of this project, the Society has just been awarded a Special Projects Grant of \$2000 through the 2023 Union County History Grant Program.

After years of work, research and a few setbacks, the Academy Bell has finally been restored to full operation. You may have heard it ring out if you were in the vicinity of Academy Street and Springfield Avenue.

On Thursday, April 20th, we have our Annual Dinner at the Vintage Tavern in Gillette. After approximately 40 years, the former 1870 Academy Bell, has been placed back in service. The bell, located in the belfry of the former Academy School, later Borough Hall, at the corner of Springfield Avenue and Academy Street can be heard at 12 noon, each day.

The New Providence Historical Society was awarded a \$2500 history grant by Union County to restore funtionality to the bell. The Society, working with the New Providence Department of Public Works, working through several setbacks, returned the bell back to full service in late January.

The bell now rings every day at 12 noon. Special thanks to Robert Keller, Rick Anderson and Ralph Parlapiano of the New Providence Department of Public Works. Their persistence and dedication were invaluable.
