



History of the White House

Everyone knows the address 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue. The White House is the official residence and workplace of the President of the United States.

Designed by Irish-born architect James Hoban, it has served as the residence for every U.S. president since John Adams in 1800.

This building and its residents have been integral to American history and world history as well. It has been a center for historical drama, including the War of 1812,



when the White House was burnt by British forces during the burning of Washington.

On Thursday, **April 18, 2024**, at the Society's Annual Dinner, historian Patricia Wells of the Chatham Township Historical Society will share her in-depth knowledge of America's Executive Mansion.

Lincoln School Sign Found

If you are old enough, you might remember Lincoln School, once located on the corner of Springfield Avenue and Academy Place. The original part of Lincoln School was constructed on what is now Centennial Park. The later parts of the school were converted into what is today's municipal center. This past fall, the Historical Society received a phone call from John Parlapiano, head of the Department of Public Works, stating he had come across the original Lincoln School sign.




The sign had been hiding on a shelf in the Board of Education's maintenance shop. Mr. Parlapiano recognized it and reached out to our historical society. The Society is currently trying to decide on how to preserve this 15-foot historic signage.


43 Floral Avenue, last occupied by **Rare Finds**, an antiques and collectibles shop, will be the future home of **Café Luna**.


