
America's First Decades

Leonard C. Blessing (104) passed away peacefully on February 9, 2025 in Charlotte, NC. He enjoyed a significant career in science education. For 61 years, his home was in New Providence, NJ where he was a member of the New Providence United Methodist Church and the New Providence Historical Society.

The Changing Face of New Providence

Coppola's Restaurant on Central Avenue has closed. Meanwhile, **Wonder**, a multi-menu restaurant has opened at 36 South Street. This location was previously rented by Wells Fargo and its banking predecessors.

The name of the Village Shopping Center has been changed by the owners to South Pass Village. Posh Spa & Nails is the expected tenant at the former Berkshire Hathaway location in the shopping center.

Martindale Hubble, formerly at 121 Chanlon Road, has relocated out of town.

IVX Health, New Providence Infusion Center is operating at 1260 Springfield Avenue, the former Elements Massage location.

A new home is under construction on one of the three lots at 166 Oakwood Drive. The center lot contains the historic white home, built in the 1890s for Pauline Schultz Von Bernuth, one of 11 children of Carl H. Schultz, the "Mineral Water King". The home was later owned by the Lenci Family, then Nat Conti

Construction is on the upswing in New Providence. The combination of residential and commercial space at **44 South Street** is approaching completion. Likewise with the construction of the Primrose Daycare and Preschool on High Street at the corner of South Street.

The bridge at the end of Passaic Street, which crosses into Chatham, is being rebuilt by Union County. It is expected to be closed for approximately a year. Expected completion is January 2026.
